Senior Citizens

The following is information regarding the senior citizen millage proposal as requested by the Human Development Commission to raise approximately \$209,000 in additional funding for senior citizen programs in the county. The proposal would add an additional day of home delivered meals which would eliminate the current waiting list for meals and allow service to all those currently in need. The additional amount requested for transportation would provide transportation for non-emergency medical such as out of town testing and chemotherapy. Adult day care service (at the HDC day care facility) would be strengthened by adding an additional day of operation.

Cost increase estimates for the proposal are summarized below and detailed in the attached spreadsheet:

1. Add one more day per week of home delivered meals to meet the demand - \$156,000
2. Improve senior transportation services including medical appointments - \$11,000
3. Improve adult day care services - \$33,000
4. Total - \$200,000

Estimated first year revenue generated:

1. Current .2 mill generates approximately - \$348,000 – average home owner cost per year \$8.
2. Additional .12 mill generates approximately - \$208,000 – average home owner cost per year \$5.
3. Total .32 mill generates - \$556,000 – average home owner cost per year \$13.

Attached is the draft senior citizen ballot language as prepared by the county attorney. This would be an eight year proposal. If approved, the millage could be levied in 2017 and generate the increased funding for the 2018 senior citizen's budget.

Sheriff Road Patrol

The following is information regarding the Sheriff Road Patrol millage proposal as requested by the Sheriff to raise approximately \$747,000 in additional funding. It includes four additional deputies which would enable 2 vehicles to be on patrol 7 days per week 24 hours per day. The Sheriff has explained currently there are times when only 1 police vehicle is on the road to serve over 800 square miles. Law enforcement officers believe this is an unacceptable situation. The other deputy would be a K-9 dog handler.

Cost increase estimates for the proposal are summarized below and detailed in the attached spreadsheet:

1. Add 4 deputies wage/fringe and other line item costs - \$452,000
2. Add 1 deputy K-9 dog handler wage/fringe and other line item costs - \$120,000
3. 50% of sheriff and undersheriff wage/fringe and other line item costs to be charged to road patrol - \$124,000 (currently all are charged to the jail budget)
4. Indirect costs of road patrol operation - \$57,000
5. Total - \$753,000

Estimated first year revenue generated:

1. Current .9 mill generates approximately - \$1,564,000 – average home owner cost per year \$36.
2. Additional .43 mill generates approximately - \$747,000 – average home owner cost per year \$17.
3. Total 1.33 mill generates - \$2,311,355 – average home owner cost per year \$53.

Attached is the draft road patrol ballot language as prepared by the county attorney. This would be an eight year proposal. If approved, the millage could be levied in 2017 and generate the increased funding for the 2018 road patrol budget,.

Proposal to Replace Senior Citizen Programs Millage

Shall Tuscola County replace the current Senior Citizen Programs millage levy of 0.2 mills due to expire in 2017, with a new levy of 0.32 mills (\$0.32 per \$1,000 of taxable value) upon the taxable value of property in Tuscola County, for a period of 8 years, 2017 through 2024, inclusive, for operation of Senior Citizen programs within Tuscola County? If approved and levied in its entirety, this millage raises an estimated \$556,000 in the first year that it is levied. All revenue will be disbursed to Tuscola County and shall be exclusively used for Senior Citizen activities within Tuscola County.

Proposal to Replace Sheriff Road Patrol Millage

Shall Tuscola County replace the current Sheriff Road Patrol millage levy of 0.9 mills due to expire in 2017, with a new levy of 1.33 mills (\$1.33 per \$1,000 of taxable value) upon the taxable value of property in Tuscola County, for a period of 8 years, 2017 through 2024, inclusive, for operation of the Tuscola County Sheriff's Road Patrol within Tuscola County? If approved and levied in its entirety, this millage raises an estimated \$2,311,000 in the first year that it is levied. All revenue will be disbursed to Tuscola County and shall be exclusively used for Sheriff's Road Patrol activities within Tuscola County.

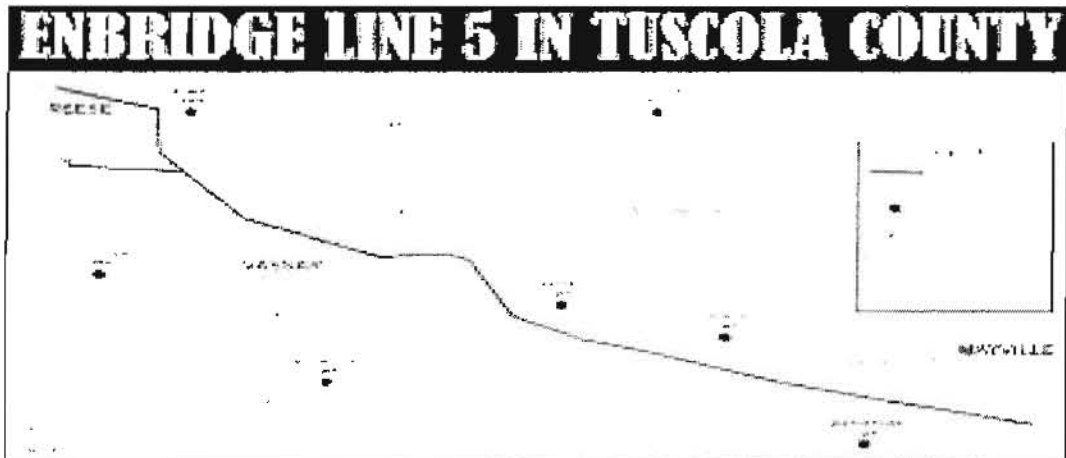
