Tuscola County will be accepting bids on the installation of a new 20'x25'x8" Concrete Pad for 2 roll off dumpsters at:

The following specifications shall be considered in your bid:

1. Contractor is responsible for any needed permits, drawing, and shall follow all local, State, and Federal codes.
2. Contractor is to provide all necessary tools and equipment needed to complete project.
3. Contractor is to provide qualified personnel for project.
4. Contractor shall excavate site to a depth of 8 inches, area has been built up with gravel in the past so additional material should not be needed.
5. Contractor shall compact sub base as needed.
6. Contractor shall install ½ inch rebar, running in both directions, 1 foot on center.
7. Contractor shall use 4000psi concrete.
8. Pad is to shed water to the south/east corner of pad.
9. Pad shall have a broom finish.
10. Contractor shall back fill around pad after completion.
11. Tuscola County Recycling will retain any unused excavated material.
12. Contractor shall be insured and provide copies of workmen's comp. before beginning work.

Proposals shall be submitted to Tuscola County Recycling 1123 Mertz Rd, Caro, MI 48723 no later than 4:00pm May 14th, 2012.
